



In this sentence, 'The cloud affects the tree by striking it with lightning. The tree is **effected** by the lightning because it has been reduced to ash, you could substitute the word to test if you have chosen the correct word. For



So, to check whether effect is the correct choice of word between affect and effect, replace effect with either Outcome, Consequence or Appearance, and if they still read well, then you made the correct

choice. If they don't read well, use affect.




